Faculty Senate resolution in memory of Karen Steckol

We wanted to share the following with our congregation:

On Friday morning, November 4, 2011, Dr. Karen F. Steckol passed away after a long and courageous battle with cancer. Karen served our Faculty Senate as President for the past three years, April 1, 2008 through March 31, 2011. She also served as UA faculty representative to The Board of Trustees of The University of Alabama System over the same three year period. She provided an exemplary model of Senate leadership and provided sound advice to President Robert E. Witt and Provost Judy Bonner regarding issues of importance to the faculty and University community. During her three years as Senate President, her accomplishments were many and included increased, mutually respectful interaction with the administration, and substantial, often behind the scenes, improvement of faculty life, particularly in the areas of benefits and student affairs.

During Sunday's funeral for Ruth the Rabbi's comments could be applied equally to both women's lives. He mentioned character as a force in life shared with family, friends, and commitment. Surely there is much for us to admire in these women's lives.

Both were successful professionals. Ruth was a nurse and Karen a speech and hearing clinician and teacher. Each contributed to the improvement of the lives of their patients. Both were involved with people. It maybe that their character development was a result of working with people who needed treatment, emotional support, and encouragement. Something we all need.

Their commitment to Judaism was demonstrated in many different ways. Participation in religious events and services, serving on the Temple Board, building committees, and our sisterhood demonstrated their dedication. Our building is a home made up of sticks and bricks which provides shelter but our community of Jews is made up of people. It is the people who make the difference!

Ruth and Karen both were strong people of character. That character is what gives us hope for the future as there will be others who will follow them and make their individual contributions to making us all better people.

We will miss them both and offer our sympathy to both families. May our next year in Judaism be better than the last one. —Joel Whitman

Karen brightened the lives of many of us since she arrived on our campus as the Chair of the Department of Communicative Disorders and Clinic Director in 2003. Karen received a Bachelor of Science degree at Indiana University in 1971, a Master of Arts degree at Memphis State University in 1972, and a Doctor of Philosophy degree at Memphis State University in 1978. She served as Assistant Professor and Associate Professor of the Department of Surgery Audiology and Speech Pathology at the University of Louisville from 1978 to 1989, as Professor and Chair of the Department of Communication Disorders at Saint Louis University from 1989 to 1994, and as Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences at Cleveland State University from 1994 to 2002 prior to coming to UA. As a Fellow of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association, during her years as a faculty member she published 33 journal articles, three peer-reviewed conference proceedings, four book chapters, two book reviews, 7 non-refereed articles and made 88 invited presentations.

She began serving on the Faculty Senate soon after arriving on the UA campus and was an active participant in Senate affairs throughout her time here. She served as Secretary of the Senate in the year 2005-06, and as Vice President for two years in 2006-08 before becoming President. Karen was not afraid to express and defend her opinions, but was gracious and balanced in considering others' viewpoints. Karen campaigned vigorously against the change several years ago in the Alabama educator state health plan, PEEHIP, which increased the cost of PEEHIP to retirees in proportion to their shortfall in years of service less than 25. Karen argued accurately that this change penalized faculty members who join our University in mid- or late career. Ironically, Karen did not get to enjoy many PEEHIP benefits.

Karen was a person of many interests. She was a serious amateur poker player. She had traveled to Las Vegas as recently as last year to participate in a tournament. She was an amateur woodworker. She loved Alabama Softball. She was a strong supporter of Hillel House and Temple Emanu-El. She worked diligently to assure that the University properly respected Jewish holy days. She traveled frequently to visit friends and family in Memphis, St. Louis and Louisville.

During most of her three years as Senate President, Karen struggled bravely to cope with major personal health issues, but never complained of her pain and suffering to others, always displayed a positive outlook and disposition, never faltered in her work and service, and served as a model of how to cope with disease to all who knew her. She told us upon running for a second term despite her cancer diagnosis that she may not have much time left and she wanted to use it doing things she enjoyed, and that she truly enjoyed Faculty Senate service and, consequently, would run for Senate President again.

Virtually all of us who knew Karen through service on the Faculty Senate admired and respected her energy, enthusiasm, generosity and graciousness. We will truly miss her.—Clark Midkiff, UA Faculty Senate President

Deepest Sympathy

This has been a sad month for our congregation.

On November 4th, we lost our congregant, friend, and board member **Karen Steckol** to a cancer she fought with her usual fierce determination for three years. She was 61. Karen was chairperson of the Department of Communicative Disorders, and the Speech and Hearing clinic, at UA. She had served several terms as president of the Faculty Senate, and was a faithful member of our Temple board, serving as an extremely effective liaison to UA until a few days before her death. She was buried in Memphis, her hometown. The Temple will hold a memorial service for her in January, inviting the public and her colleagues to join us in remembering her.

On November 25th, our dear **Ruth Weiss Carlin** died at 81 after several years of coping with cancer. Ruth and Elmer retired to Tuscaloosa over 15 years ago, and immediately became active in Emanu-El. But Ruth, a nurse for 40 years, never 'retired' all the way. She not only served on the Temple board, was a co-president of Sisterhood, managed our building fund, and volunteered for everything that came up, but she helped found Caring Days, volunteered at Verner's library, and found time to join other community groups. Her devotion to Elmer, Sandy, Joanie, Jim, Stefan, David, and her "fabulous" grandsons Noah and Nathan was a big part of what everyone loved about Ruth.

Finally, the Singer-Jacobs family mourns the loss in November of two extraordinary people from outside our community. Sheila Cheimetz, cousin of Norman Singer, accomplished so much in her life that the Boston Globe gave her a half-page obituary. You can Google her name at bostonglobe.com. And Bernice Kliman, a Shakespearean scholar and a favorite colleague of Henry Jacobs, also became a favorite friend of ours and 'extra mother' to Joanna and Stephanie. She was a teacher, writer, actor, mother, cook, and true woman of valor.
