From Rabbi Jacobs The Two-State Solution?



Dear Friends:

Many, many years ago, I came to the conclusion that the only successful solution to the complex and ongoing tragedy of the Arab-Palestinian/Israeli conflict was a two-state solution—that those who wished to live under an Israeli flag in a democratic Jewish state, governed predominantly by Jews and reflective of the time-honored and historical Jewish values we cherish should have the freedom to do so. And that those who did not should also have the option to live in another nation state, contiguous to the borders of Israel—a Palestinian state—with porous boundaries whereby the free flow of goods, services, cultures, technologies, etc. would continue to enhance the lives of the people living in both countries.

At the time, it proved to be an unpopular solution and suggestion, and many of us who proposed it were the objects of ongoing and too-often strident criticism.

Today, it seems to me that part of the world is now moving toward that reality, though what disturbs me most is that it is doing so for the all the wrong reasons. Recalcitrance on both sides continues to present stumbling blocks, and the several Latin American countries who have already indicated they are willing to accord official recognition of Palestine's declaration of sovereignty do so, in part, I believe, as a slam against the United States with a little (or lot) of antisemitism thrown in for good measure.

Thus, moving towards Palestine as a nation state is not the result of a *sicha*—a conversation—between Israel and the Palestinians but the ongoing crisis which includes meddling others who have other agendas.

One can only pray—which I do daily—that the ultimate solution of a Palestinian state will be so for the right reasons, not the wrong ones.

From the President

You and I share a religion filled with history, tradition, cultural patterns and formulae for living. Last night the Torah portion had a section that at the end spelled out the Ten Commandments in a form that was different from the preceding and following forms found in the scripture. The Rabbi's discussion following this portion raised many questions for our consideration.

I hope to deal with my understandings our obligations and responsibilities as members of Temple Emanu-El. Many of us enjoy our Jewish identity through birth and others by choice. Yet we share all of these same obligations.

1. To attend services when we are able.
2. To educate ourselves about Torah.
3. To recommit ourselves as Jews every day of our lives.
4. To educate our children in our traditions, scripture, history, and culture.

How we fulfill these responsibilities and obligations is an individual choice. Reform Judaism as the Rabbi explains is a liberal form of our religion when compared to Orthodoxy and Conservatism. I believe the result is our ability to individually determine what choices we make i.e., to attend or not to attend services and how we participate. That is a decision I can and will defend.

On the other hand we are very fortunate to have between 16 and 20 people who observe that Sabbath services with us for each service. In my opinion it is a duty to pray for ourselves, our families, the sick or infirm, and those who have died. In this way we keep them alive through memory and deed. Fortunately, we always have more than a minyan.

It is not a question of our services being too orthodox, conservative, or reformed. It seems to me it is an obligation that all of us must seriously consider. Not who is a Jew but what is a Jew. Only you individually can decide what kind of Jew you are or could become! We hope you can be one who freely commits of his or her time to strengthen the Tuscaloosa Jewish family by active participation. I look forward to your active participation in your Temple.

Art and Materials Donation Policy

As passed by the Temple Board 9/14/2010

Rules for accepting donations of material items (i.e., non-financial donations)

1. The Board of Temple Emanu-El will accept all appropriate gifts.
2. Donations of material items will be acknowledged *per se*, for instance: "Thank you for the generous donation of 2 paintings and 1 lithograph." In no instance will acknowledgement of a donation of material items make any mention of a dollar figure.
3. It is the responsibility of the donor
 - (a) to keep a record of the nature of the donated items which the donor may choose to attach to an acknowledgement from Temple Emanu-El of the receipt of the donated items. In the case of newly-purchased items being donated to Temple Emanu-El, this record can be the sales receipt from said purchase;
 - and
 - (b) to place a value on the donated items for his/her own records and tax purposes. If the donor expects to place a high value on any donation(s), it is suggested that donor *obtain his own appraisal* prior to making the donation.
4. Once donated, **items become the sole property of Temple Emanu-El of Tuscaloosa, Alabama, Inc., to use, store, or dispose of as Temple Emanu-El's officers, Board, and committees may see fit.**

Particularly in the case of artwork, a committee appointed by the Board will be responsible for choosing what to hang on walls or display in cabinets. This committee may, from time to time, rotate artwork or change its position depending on available wall space.
5. A copy of this policy shall be provided to all donors of material items.
