## From Rabbi Jacobs

Dear Friends:



I'm writing this message two days before Louanne and I leave for a week at the beach with daughter, son-in-law, three of five grandkids and son and best friend for a much-needed vacation. As I think about it, two thoughts immediately pop into my head:

#1: We are not machines or robotic creatures but biological beings who need on a regular basis opportunities to recharge our physical, emotional, and spiritual batteries. Our week will do just that. But so too, Jewishly, is our weekly Shabbat opportunity. And not only our Worship Service to which I always invite you to join us, but the whole day as well. Shabbat provides us with an opportunity to do some battery recharging which the hectic pace of the rest of the week does not. That is its great strength and opportunity. Dip into a book which you've been wanting to read and which bears no relationship to anything else! Try a new restaurant (with a good bottle of wine) and enjoy the occasion. Visit a place you've always wanted to go. Make the day special on a regular basis and watch the change in your overall persona.

#2: The mainstay and success of our Jewish people has and remains the primary emphasis we continue to place on our families. The joy of our connectedness remains central even if we do not always get along. But, interestingly enough and significantly enough, we Jews have also kicked it up to the next level: The entirety of our Jewish people is one big family, not all of whom agree with each other all the time and not all of whom even like each other all the time. But family we are and family we remain. And that has been, is, and will be the source of our strength. So, as I prepare to leave for the beach, an additional thought: Is there a member of your own family with whom you have not been in contact for far too long? Is there a family relationship that has been broken for reasons that are so far in the past that you really can't recall? Now is the time for reconnection. Before we know it, Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur will be upon us inaugurating a new year. What a wonderful way to set the stage by strengthening the family bonds that remain and make us who we truly are!

## From the President

In the past several months our Temple and its congregants have experienced joy, exultation, and seen the suffering and pain caused by the storms that visited Tuscaloosa. We shared in the joy of Morgan and Sam's reading of the Torah and the first B'nai Mitzvot held in our new home. We also felt the force of the tornadoes that visited our city. We saw the television pictures and listened to the radio reports of what people experienced through their loss of homes, possessions and in some cases lives.

Our Temple acted as a pass-through for relief funds that could be funneled through our organization to the appropriate agencies. We received \$5,000.00 from the URJ, an individual donation of \$2,300.00, and a number of smaller individual donations. According to the wishes of the donors most funds went to the Compassionate Coalition. Other smaller amounts went to the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund for distribution, and to our Jewish United Appeal Fund. Individuals volunteered their time and energy by participating in other kinds of relief efforts.

We need to have a congregational meeting in August or early September for several reasons. These are:

- To adopt our annual religious calendar.
- To adopt our annual budget.
- To provide information about parking arrangements for the High Holidays.
- To explain the reasons for gating the lot closest to the Temple and Bloom Hillel.
- To inform all about Board vacancies due to resignations.
- To form a nominations Committee.

We have enjoyed and benefited from the commitment and services provided by Doris Cohen, Gale Zumpano, and Dr. Ed Schnee. We will also lose Larry Fagen and Joel Whitman at the end of their term next June.

We have practiced good citizenship but more importantly we were living up to the standards of being Jewish.

One last note: we also received a grant for \$500.00 for Shabbat Prayer books from an individual.

- Anna Singer is working on completing **exterior and interior signage**. Exterior signage will conform to basic UA requirements. We would like to have directional signs at the corners of University and 4<sup>th</sup>, but we may not install those on public property. We're working on a solution for that problem.
- **Kitchen** has mostly been organized. Please note the rules about **how to use the kitchen sinks**, posted above each sink compartment.

- **A new piece of furniture** is in place—a small buffet in the all-purpose room for coffee/snack service during meetings.

**Playground:** Parents and staff will need to make choices about what equipment to put in. **Note:** UA has approved our making a special pathway to the playground, using 12x12 custom blocks that children (and adults) can decorate. We'll charge for these to help purchase the playground equipment.

## Tornado Relief



### Bryant Bank gives truck to Compassion Coalition

Temple Emanu-El is a founding member of Compassion Coalition, a group of Tuscaloosa congregations and social service organizations. It was conceived from the lessons of Hurricane Katrina, to make sure Tuscaloosa was prepared to meet the needs of the community if disaster struck.

And disaster did strike on April 27. See below for ways to continue helping:

- If you prefer to give through a Jewish organization, you can mail checks to our own **Jewish United Appeal Fund**, 903 20<sup>th</sup> Ave, Tuscaloosa, AL 35401. The JUAF is the 401c-3 non-profit umbrella organization that includes Temple and Hillel as members. Please mark the checks "tornado relief." The JUAF will pass on 100% of your funds to one or more of the following:
- **Temporary Emergency Services (TES), a United Way agency.** TES is at 1705 15<sup>th</sup> St, near the corner of Queen City and 15<sup>th</sup> and across from Shelby Park. Their storefront and office has been supplemented by a large donated warehouse space next door, and another in Northport. TES gives CLOTHING, HOUSEHOLD ITEMS AND FOOD out to families and individuals who have been referred by other aid agencies. Sisterhood has donated its garage-sale items to TES. They also need BUILDING MATERIALS. But they badly need FUNDS. You can send checks directly to them at 1705 15<sup>th</sup> St., Tuscaloosa, 35401.
- **Compassion Coalition of Tuscaloosa County (CCTC) is "Volunteer Central."** CCTC is a 401c-3 group of Tuscaloosa congregations of which Temple Emanu-El is a founding member. It is designed to act as a volunteer coordination agency. The current president is Sheldon Rosenzweig, a Temple member. Compassionate Coalition sprang into action as soon as the tornado had passed.
