Regardless of our position on these issues, and regardless of how critical or supportive we choose to be, during this month of December / Kislev it is important to remind ourselves that our freedom to be both Americans and Jews comes with an all-to-often heavy price tag: that others lose their lives so that we may live ours. As we light each candle in our *m'norat*, let each of us say a silent prayer for each of those who stepped up willingly to offer the ultimate sacrifice not only in defense of these United States, but of Israel as well. And may our ages-old dream of Shalom for our world be fulfilled as well.

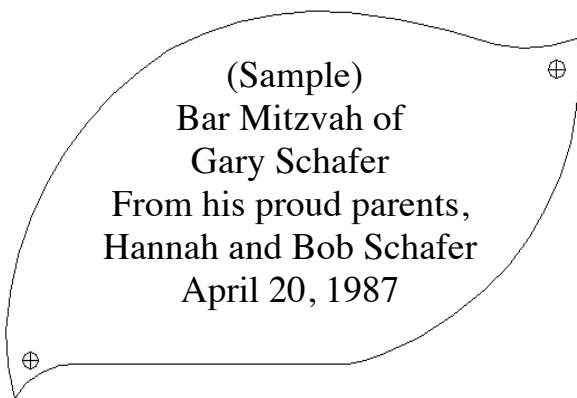
