From Rabbi Jacobs



Dear Friends,

Hiddush—Freedom of Religion for Israel, Inc., has just released its 2011 "The Israel Religion and State Index." Because Israel is presently undergoing a mega-cultural crisis regarding the hareidim (fundamentalists) and other Israelis as well as gender issues, I want to share with you their major findings. (More than one commentator both in Israel and the United States has written about the implications of these culture wars, which Israel simply cannot afford, and the negativity surrounding them given the political intrigues of the present moment.)

- 80% of the Israeli public is dissatisfied with the government handling of issues of religion and state.
- 83% of the population supports the existence of freedom of religion and conscience in Israel, but most of the ultra-Orthodox (51%) do not support it.
- 56% of Jewish Israelis support the separation of religion and state.
- 64% view the tensions between secular and ultra-Orthodox Jews as either the most (37%) or the second most (27%) acute conflict in Israeli Jewish society, more than any other rift.

- 93% of the non-ultra-Orthodox Jewish public and 87% of all Jewish Israelis believe that yeshiva students should be required to do either military or civil service.
- 79% of Jewish Israelis favor reducing government funding for yeshivas and families with many children in order to encourage ultra-Orthodox men to integrate into the workforce, an increase of 11% from previous year.
- 65% of the Jewish public believes that the absence of ultra-Orthodox men from the workforce and these yeshiva subsidies are some of the essential reasons for the heavy burden on the Israeli middle class.
- 80% of the Jewish population is in favor of requiring ultra-Orthodox schools to employ core curricular studies, including math, science and civics.
- 62% are in favor of denying funding to schools that do not teach these subjects.
- 43% of respondents (and 55% of secular Jews) support Yair Lapid's entrance into political life, of which 24% want him to head an independent party.
- 61% of the Jewish population supports the passing of a law which would preclude those who had committed serious criminal offenses from running for Knesset and serving in the government.
- 47% of Jewish women (and 50% of non-ultra-Orthodox women) would not board a gender segregated bus line.
- 63% of the Jewish public support offering public transportation on Shabbat fully or on a limited basis, as compared to 58% in the winter of 2010.
- 52%, more than half the Jewish Israeli public, support recognition of same-sex marriages.
- 69% of secular respondents support this position.
- 62% of Israeli Jews are in favor of recognition of all forms of marriage, include Conservative, Reform and civil. (This is compared to 55% in the Index of Winter 2010.)
- 61% of the Jewish population support recognition of conversation of all streams of Judaism.
- 29% of the respondents also support recognition of secular conversions.

What these figures collectively reveal to this American Zionist Jew and Rabbi is that Israel is changing, painfully and all-too slowly, and that the success of the change will mark both a going forward and a return to the original dream of its Zionist founders: a nation-state where all Jews, regardless of their individual and/or collective identities and expressions, will be at home.

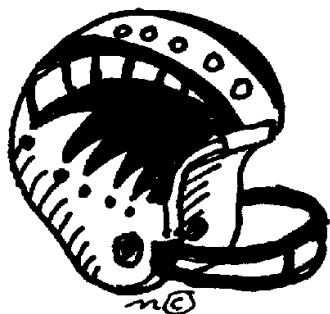
