Suggestions for 5774



From my Rosh Ha-Shanah talk:

- (1) A new mini-adult education course if 5-6 sessions of 90-minutes each to begin after the first of the New Year, and to be entitled "An Introduction to Our Literary Heritage." (Registration and sign-up and commitment required.)
- (2) To be participating members in the "Communities in Conversation" of Jewish-Christian-Muslim dialogue as more information is made available to us, with registration, sign-up, and commitment to attend every session.
- (3) That our Mitzvah/Social Action Committee form a joint task-force with Hillel to undertake a *serious* examination of the needs of our greater Tuscaloosa community and how we may best involve ourselves.
- (4) That our Program/Social Committee think, plan, and dream "outside the box," regarding programs and ideas that will bring us closer to one another in friendship and appreciation and affection. Nothing, at least initially, should be off the table!
- (5) That our Ritual Committee meet and explore even more ways to sanctify together our lives as Jews—e.g. celebration of adult *Barai Mitzvah* for those who have not yet celebrated, either individually or

Changes in Membership Categories & Dues

The constitutional amendment approved at the 2013 Annual Meeting established the following membership categories and minimum dues levels:

- **Family:** \$1300
- **Senior Family:** \$1040 (20% discount from Family)
- **Individual (Single):** \$650
- **Senior Individual (Single), a new category:** \$520 (20% discount from Single)
- **Associate Status** (for those with full membership in another synagogue; non-voting): 50% of applicable category

Note: "Family" is defined as a household with more than one adult. "Senior" is age 65 and over.

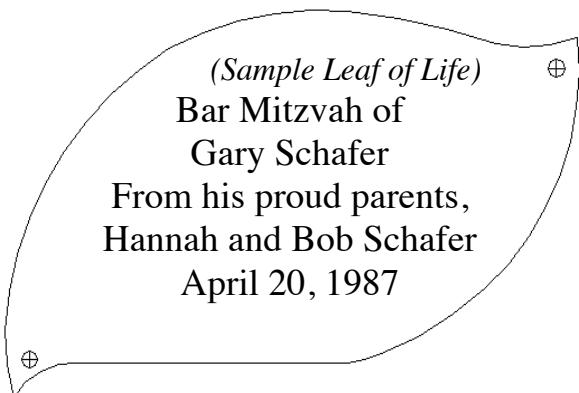
Leaves of Life

collectively; renewal of marriage vows in our Sanctuary underneath the *chuppah*; significant birthday celebrations at worship services with an *Oneg* to follow; publicly celebrating at worship the giving of Hebrew names to those who do not yet have them, etc.

- (6) That every family in our Congregation make the commitment to purchase *one* celebratory leaf on our *Etz Haim*/our Tree of Life marking a special and joyous family event.
- (7) Let our Temple Board create and Inter-religious Dialogue Committee to begin meeting, thinking, and planning how we can best structure an invitation to our "G-d Quad" neighbors for a series of informal and informational sessions at which we will have the opportunity to share our history, philosophy/theology, holidays, life-cycle celebrations, and contemporary concerns with a culminating occasion to worship with us, and by which we will commit ourselves to do the same with our neighbors. (Round two, because of our success, will then be "taken on the road," to other congregations in the greater Tuscaloosa area, including the Mosque of Tuscaloosa, the Muslim Student Association, Orthodox synagogue Kneseth Israel and Bais Ariel, the Chabad Center, in Birmingham.)

From my Yom Kippur talk:

- (1) That our Temple Board send a letter to President Rick Jacobs of the Union for Reform Judaism that, as a proud Reform Congregation, we cannot abide any discrimination against women in Israel, especially at the Western Wall, urging him to continue to address this issue in even more forceful terms. And that we invite any and all members of our Congregation who wish to do so to sign this letter as well.
- (2) That we as a Congregation invite any and all the women members of our Jewish community to worship with us on such and such a date to be decided and announced in advance, and that you all come to do so wearing both *tallit*/prayer shawl, and *kippah*/yarmulke as a show of solidarity with our sisters in Israel (*Nashot HaKotel*/Women of the Wall), and that you allow us not only to take their picture collectively but that we display that picture proudly in our building for all to see.
