Dear Friends

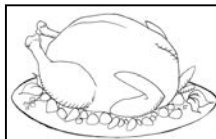

Membership Categories & Dues

The constitutional amendment approved at the Annual Meeting in June, 2013 established the following membership categories and minimum dues levels:

- **Family:** \$1300
- **Senior Family:** \$1040 (20% discount from Family)
- **Individual (Single):** \$650
- **Senior Individual (Single), a new category:** \$520 (20% discount from Single)
- **Associate Status** (for those with full membership in another synagogue; non-voting): 50% of applicable category

Note: "Family" is defined as a household with more than one person. "Senior" is age 65 and over.

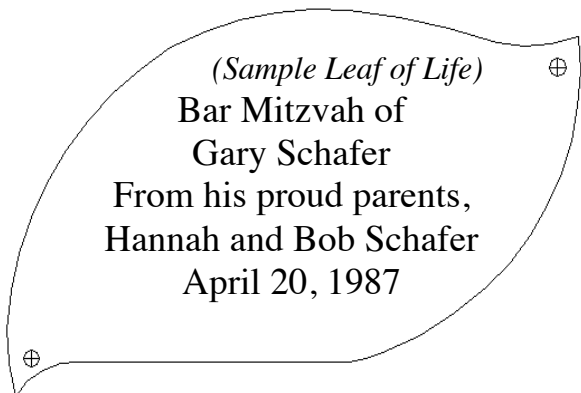
Leaves of Life

The Jewish United Appeal Fund of Tuscaloosa is a united appeal fund as defined by the State of Alabama. At present, JUAF has two Jewish-community members: Temple Emanu-El, and Hillel. By law, a united appeal fund must engage in annual fundraising, and distribute funds to its constituent members. JUAF raises funds by selling parking tags for home games. On December 1, 2013, JUAF made an equal distribution of those revenues to its constituent organizations.

By charter, the JUAF is governed by a board of four officers, two from Temple Emanu-El and two from Hillel's board. The officers at present are: Hattie Kaufman, President; Star Bloom, Vice President; Anna Singer, Treasurer, and Don Siegel, Secretary.—Anna Singer

LimmudFest New Orleans



LimmudFest New Orleans is a weekend celebration of Jewish learning and community that brings Jews from all corners of the region together for a unique shared educational experience.

LimmudFest New Orleans 2014 expands to three days, including all of Shabbat. On Friday and Saturday, there will be a variety of religious services, followed by common meals and learning sessions, in the spaces of Temple

Sinai. On Sunday, the learning and celebration will take place at Tulane University's Lavin-Bernick Center.

There will be 90 learning sessions offered on everything Jewish: Israel, Spirituality, Contemporary Jewish Life and Identity, Arts & Culture, Social Justice, Text and Thought, History, and Family. Local, national, and international presenters will be sharing their passions on topics ranging from pickle-making to why saving the wetlands is a Jewish issue, to Punk Torah, to children's concerts. Three of our 75 presenters are Clive Lawton, Noa Baum, and Amy Meltzer.

Registration fees vary by age. For all three days, Adults 30 years and older pay \$75, while Young Adults, 18–30, pay \$40 and Children, 17 and younger, are \$15. For Saturday night and all day Sunday, Adults pay \$50, Young Adults pay \$25, and Children pay \$5. This fee includes all the kosher meals and snacks, children's activities, and babysitting.

Home hospitality for Shabbat, including for Shomer Shabbat participants, is available and encouraged! Session programming will be updated frequently, with the complete list published in February. Registration and volunteer sign-up opens on January 1st. For session program updates, registration, and volunteer sign-up, go to www.limmudnola.org
