## From Rabbi Jacobs

### An Interesting Parenthesis

Dear Friends:

One of the online Judaic periods to which I subscribe is *Tablet Magazine* ([www.tabletmag.com](http://www.tabletmag.com)). Recently January 18th, Liora Halpern, Assistant Professor at Princeton University, reported on the fact, at least at the doctoral/PhD level, Hebrew University's Academic Senate voted to allow dissertations to be accepted in both Hebrew and English. In so doing, it created a bit of a minor firestorm.

Why so? Ever since the founding of the State of Israel in 1948, Israel has prided itself on its ability to integrate into its country diverse populations whose first language is other than Hebrew. Indeed, the revolutionary intensive Hebrew learning program known as Ulpan has achieved remarkable success. In a relative short span of time, olim/immigrants are able to integrate themselves into Israeli society as they continue to improve their language skills.

## Rabbi's message, continued

And yet, other voices have also argued that if Israel is intent on considering itself a member of the world community of nations, equally, its scientists, literateurs, and other scholars need to also be conversant in the lingua franca of humanity if its cultural and scientific productivity is to be shared and the dialogue is to be beneficial to all concerned.

As Jews, it is important to note that even our Talmud suggests that one is, indeed, permitted to pray in the language of the community, assuming one is less than fluent in Hebrew. And yet, I would suggest, that our religious tradition is not an "either-or journey," either Hebrew or, in our case, English. Judaism is and has been throughout our history an "and journey." The richness of much of Judaism is the result of an interaction with the larger communities and societies and those insights brought to our attention and Judaically transformed.

Our Siddur/Prayer Book epitomizes this duality. Taken together, the Hebrew and English of our prayers provide a richer opportunity for us to stretch our spiritual yearnings, reaching upwards to G-d. The goal, unlike Hebrew University, is, in fact, the reverse: Comfortable with the language of our society, English, our obligation is to learn Hebrew, to become reasonably knowledgeable with the rich sources of our tradition in their original language: Torah, Talmud, Midrash, Responsa, Codes.

Without wanting to date myself (some of you may know this reference), I can only cite Mikey's siblings when they placed a bowl of cereal in front of him insisting he wouldn't like it: Lo and behold, "he likes it!" So, too, learning and praying in both Hebrew and English and reading Torah in Hebrew and English: Try it, you might like it!

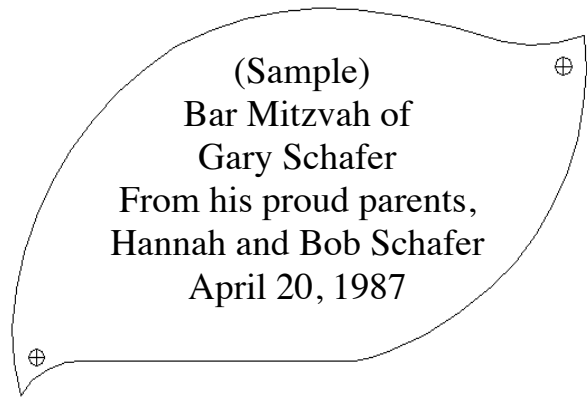

## Social Action Committee News:

### *A Morning at the Food Bank*

Ten temple ladies helped at the West Alabama Food Bank on December 6th, for a couple of hours. We packed secret meals for hungry children, helped stock the store that then distributes to charities throughout nine West Alabama counties, and stuffed envelopes. Next time we'll take pictures to show what a great job we did. And we had a good time together.

Our assembly-line bag-stuffing operation would have made Henry Ford proud. Within a two-hour period we think we may have stuffed around 500 bags of food that will be distributed to qualified kids on Friday to take home for weekend meals so they won't be hungry. Around 1000 bags of food go to kids every week this way.

Then half of us met at Fifth and Main and schmoozed over lunch, which is always a fun thing to do.

Our work at the Food Bank was really appreciated (they don't seem to have that much staff) and that made us feel really good. And, as Jewish women, we felt we were building a sense of community amongst ourselves and fulfilling an historic tenet of our faith, to do good works or mitzvahs for others.
