From Rabbi Jacobs



The lazy days of summer—time to read!

Dear Friends:

I have just finished reviewing several volumes for the next issue of the *Journal for the Study of Antisemitism*, where I have the honor to serve as US Associate Editor. Among these were three novels which I want to recommend during these upcoming months of spiritual, emotional, intellectual and physical battery recharging.

The first is *A Grain of Truth* (in translation) by Zygmunt Miloszewski. It is a crime novel/police procedural in which a series of murders in modern-day Poland in the town of Sandomierz outside of Warsaw are investigated by a detective who rejects the antisemitic assumption that the Jews are responsible. In the aftermath of the Second World War, antisemitism still continues to be a blot on an otherwise progressive society. Well worth the effort with a surprising conclusion.

The second is *The Blood of Lorraine* by Barbara Corrado Pope and is set at the end of the 19th/early 20th centuries around the time of the infamous espionage treason trial of French Jewish Army Captain Alfred Dreyfus, which hovers in the background. Again, a murder takes place and public opinion holds the Jews of Lorraine responsible. The crime is investigated by French gentile magistrate

The Annual Meeting was well attended, and well conducted by co-President Hattie Kaufman. An important amendment to the Constitution, having to do with membership rules and categories, was passed by unanimous vote. Please see

Changes in Membership Categories & Dues

The constitutional amendment approved at the Annual Meeting established the following membership categories and minimum dues levels:

- **Family:** \$1300
- **Senior Family:** \$1040 (20% discount from Family)
- **Individual (Single):** \$650
- **Senior Individual (Single), a new category:** \$520 (20% discount from Single)
- **Associate Status** (for those with full membership in another synagogue; non-voting): 50% of applicable category

Note: "Family" is defined as a household with more than one adult. "Senior" is age 65 and over.

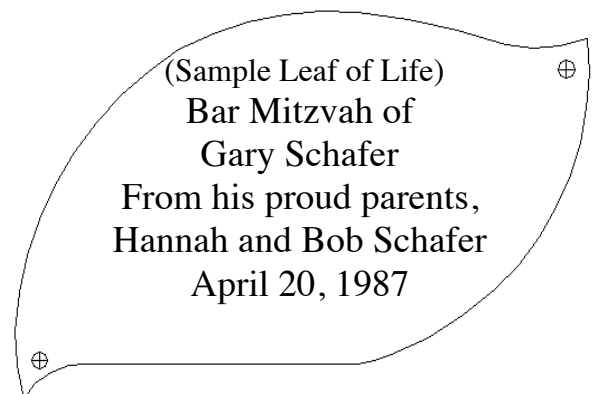
Treasury Notes

(Temple Emanu-El of Tuscaloosa, ARTICLE IV revised and adopted by Congregational vote 5-2013)

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Any person of the age of sixteen (16) or over professing the Jewish religion, or desiring to adopt or associate with the Jewish religion, shall be eligible for membership in this Congregation. Membership shall be available without regard to race, sex, color, sexual orientation, or national origin.

Section 2. The basic units of membership shall be an Individual Membership and a Family Membership.

A. An Individual Membership covers only one individual.

B. A Family Membership covers one or more adults living in the same household and their dependent children, if any. All privileges of membership shall be extended to unmarried, dependent children, except the right to vote or hold office. Each adult in a Family Membership unit shall have the right to vote and hold office.

C. Other membership sub-categories may be established by the Board of Trustees as needed.

Section 3. Any individual or family desiring to become a member shall submit a completed membership form along with arrangements for payment for such membership. The Board of Trustees shall establish a procedure for accepting such applicants. Once accepted, such applicants shall become members and shall be so notified by the Board of Trustees.

Section 4. Honorary membership shall be conferred upon the Rabbi and his/her family. However, honorary membership does not carry with it the right to vote or hold office in the Congregation.

Section 5. Individuals and families who are full members in good standing in another Jewish congregation, but who wish to maintain a relationship with this Congregation, may apply for Associate status. In addition to submitting an Associate form and arrangements for payment of Associate dues, Associates shall also be required to submit evidence of full, current, membership in their home congregations.

Section 6. The privileges of members in good standing (members who have met their financial obligations to this Congregation as established by the Board of Trustees) shall be:

A. to vote at all annual and special meetings of the Congregation and be eligible to hold an elected office.

B. to attend all meetings of the Board of Trustees.

C. to enroll their children in the Congregation's Religious School, subject to the rules and regulations of the Religious School Committee and the Board of Trustees.

D. to hold life cycle events at Temple Emanu-El in accordance with the policies and requirements of the Ritual Committee and the Board of Trustees. These privileges of membership shall be available only to members in good standing.

Section 7. The obligations of members and Associates shall be to meet the financial obligations as set forth by the Board of Trustees.

Section 8. Any member who is in arrears for dues for a period of one (1) year shall be deprived of the rights of membership, and shall be notified of such status by the Treasurer of this Congregation, and if arrearage is not paid upon such request, such member's name shall be stricken from the membership in this Congregation. No person shall be eligible for re-instatement as a member of this Congregation until any arrearage has been paid.

Section 9. The dues structure shall be determined by the Board of Trustees. In addition, other membership sub-categories, with their attendant dues structures, may be established by the Board of Trustees as needed.

Bernard Martin at the urging of his Jewish counterpart David Singer. Fraught with political implications, it reveals the distancing between French and Jewish cultures little more than century after the Revolution and the achievement of Jewish citizenship (1789/1791), and is equally a good read.

The year is 1952, the Germans have won the Second World War and are in control of the African continent. Suspenseful and fast-paced, the issue is to prevent an expansion of the Nazi agenda to England and the United States.
