From Rabbi Jacobs



Happy New Year—5774!

Dear Friends:

Difficult as it is for me to believe, Rosh Ha-Shanah is almost upon us; our marvelous Jewish opportunity to begin again, anew, and refreshed in body and spirit. Tradition tells us that it will be the New Jewish Year of 5,774 (metaphorically according to the creation of the world, or, in Hebrew, *livriat haolam*). Not literally of course, but for a people who can trace its origins back approximately 6,000 years to the Ancient Middle East, what does that say about us?

First, that we are, truly, the only people recorded in our Holy Torah who have survived, prospered, and grown, and returned sixty-five years ago to our land of birth. My late teacher of Jewish and Rabbinic Thought, Jakob J. Petuchowski, *alav hashalom* (May he continue to rest in peace), one day in class made the insightful comment, "The continuing existence of the Jewish People, despite all the evidence to the contrary and all the attempts to do away with us, is evidence of our eternal covenant with G-d and proof of G-d's existence as well." Well worth pondering, indeed.

Second, that the Brith/Covenant with G-d manifests itself in two important ways for us Jews and those who choose of their own accord to stand with us: (1) that we will celebrate our relationship with G-d through

The Annual Meeting was well attended, and well conducted by co-President Hattie Kaufman. An important amendment to the Constitution, having to do with membership rules and categories, was passed by unanimous vote. Please see

Changes in Membership Categories & Dues

The constitutional amendment approved at the Annual Meeting established the following membership categories and minimum dues levels:

- **Family:** \$1300
- **Senior Family:** \$1040 (20% discount from Family)
- **Individual (Single):** \$650
- **Senior Individual (Single), a new category:** \$520 (20% discount from Single)
- **Associate Status** (for those with full membership in another synagogue; non-voting): 50% of applicable category

Note: "Family" is defined as a household with more than one adult. "Senior" is age 65 and over.

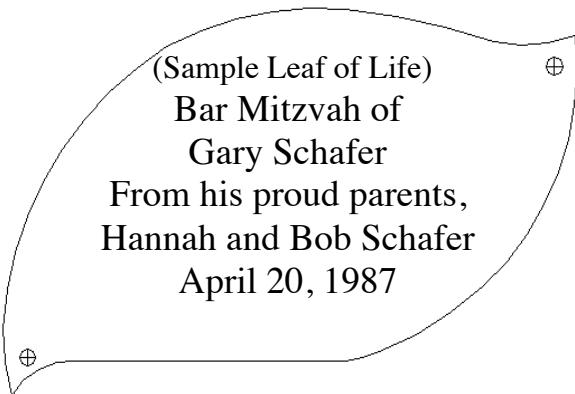
Leaves of Life

JUAF

The Jewish United Appeal Fund of Tuscaloosa is a united appeal fund as defined by the State of Alabama. At present, JUAF has two Jewish-community members: Temple Emanu-El, and Hillel. By law, a united appeal fund must engage in annual fundraising, and distribute funds to its constituent members. JUAF raises funds by selling parking tags for home games. On December 31, 2012, JUAF made an equal distribution of those revenues to its constituent organizations. In January, the JUAF made a contribution to the Springhill Ave. Temple in Mobile, to help with their tornado repairs.

By charter, the JUAF is governed by a board of four officers, two from Temple Emanu-El and two from Hillel's board. The officers at present are: Hattie Kaufman, President; Star Bloom, Vice President; Anna Singer, Treasurer, and Don Siegel, Secretary.—Anna Singer

(Temple Emanu-El of Tuscaloosa, ARTICLE IV revised and adopted by Congregational vote 5-2013)

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Any person of the age of sixteen (16) or over professing the Jewish religion, or desiring to adopt or associate with the Jewish religion, shall be eligible for membership in this Congregation. Membership shall be available without regard to race, sex, color, sexual orientation, or national origin.

Section 2. The basic units of membership shall be an Individual Membership and a Family Membership.

A. An Individual Membership covers only one individual.

B. A Family Membership covers one or more adults living in the same household and their dependent children, if any. All privileges of membership shall be extended to unmarried, dependent children, except the right to vote or hold office. Each adult in a Family Membership unit shall have the right to vote and hold office.

C. Other membership sub-categories may be established by the Board of Trustees as needed.

Section 3. Any individual or family desiring to become a member shall submit a completed membership form along with arrangements for payment for such membership. The Board of Trustees shall establish a procedure for accepting such applicants. Once accepted, such applicants shall become members and shall be so notified by the Board of Trustees.

Section 4. Honorary membership shall be conferred upon the Rabbi and his/her family. However, honorary membership does not carry with it the right to vote or hold office in the Congregation.

Section 5. Individuals and families who are full members in good standing in another Jewish congregation, but who wish to maintain a relationship with this Congregation, may apply for Associate status. In addition to submitting an Associate form and arrangements for payment of Associate dues, Associates shall also be required to submit evidence of full, current, membership in their home congregations.

Section 6. The privileges of members in good standing (members who have met their financial obligations to this Congregation as established by the Board of Trustees) shall be:

A. to vote at all annual and special meetings of the Congregation and be eligible to hold an elected office.

B. to attend all meetings of the Board of Trustees.

C. to enroll their children in the Congregation's Religious School, subject to the rules and regulations of the Religious School Committee and the Board of Trustees.

D. to hold life cycle events at Temple Emanu-El in accordance with the policies and requirements of the Ritual Committee and the Board of Trustees. These privileges of membership shall be available only to members in good standing.

Section 7. The obligations of members and Associates shall be to meet the financial obligations as set forth by the Board of Trustees.

Section 8. Any member who is in arrears for dues for a period of one (1) year shall be deprived of the rights of membership, and shall be notified of such status by the Treasurer of this Congregation, and if arrearage is not paid upon such request, such member's name shall be stricken from the membership in this Congregation. No person shall be eligible for re-instatement as a member of this Congregation until any arrearage has been paid.

Section 9. The dues structure shall be determined by the Board of Trustees. In addition, other membership sub-categories, with their attendant dues structures, may be established by the Board of Trustees as needed.

- **Family:** \$1300

- **Individual (Single):** \$650
