Temple Emanuel has been volunteering about once each month for about 1 1/2 hours to help the West Alabama Food Bank. We've been doing this for over a year (sorry I haven't kept records). We are usually about 5 to 8 women who do the packing of secret meals for hungry children that are sent home with needy school children for weekend nourishment. Sometimes we help by packing senior meals or we sort and stack food for the grocery store which is used by various agencies and churches to fill their pantries. And sometimes there is a need to repair packages that are somewhat torn or crushed. We do what we can to help and believe we are doing good and are appreciated. The West Alabama Food Bank will find checks most helpful but they will be happy to receive food donations as well. There will be a basket for these donations. Peanut butter is a top priority. *Please check the expiration dates.* Canned goods are good at least 5 years past the expiration date, but dry boxes (cereals, cake mixes) should be dated no earlier than February 2013.
