Purim and Pesach—Birds of a Feather?

Dear Friends:



There is a joke out there that says the story of Jewish history can be eclipsed with the words: "They tried to destroy us. They didn't. Let's eat!"

The intertwining of the negativities of the past with the celebrations of the present (and future) is indeed, a collective indicator of our own self-awareness, for which we should all be grateful. Without knowledge of our Jewish past, our Jewish present becomes a hollow shell filled with emptiness, and our Jewish future unrealizable.

We are a people who have built our present and future upon the foundational backs of our predecessors who give so much of their energy, time, talent, and skills so that we could be here today. And for which we should all be eternally grateful as well.

The simplest of tropes, at same time perhaps the most meaningful, is one sentence: "With Jews there will be no Judaism; without Judaism there will be no Jews". As a people we are the inheritors of our history and builders of our own present and future.

Membership Categories & Dues

The following membership categories and minimum dues levels were approved by congregational vote at the Annual Meeting in June, 2013:

- **Family:** \$1300
 - **Senior Family:** \$1040 (20% discount from Family)
 - **Individual (Single):** \$650
 - **Senior Individual (Single), a new category:** \$520 (20% discount from Single)
 - **Associate Status** (for those with full membership in another synagogue; non-voting): 50% of applicable category
- Note: "Family" is defined as a household with more than one person. "Senior" is age 65 and over.*

These may be purchased for simchas—for instance, anniversaries, landmark birthdays, graduations, births, b'nai mitzvot, or other occasions. ARZA: Cast a Vote for Reform Values in Israel

The Association of Reform Zionists of America is Reform Judaism's support group for Israel. Arza delegates are running for positions on the World Zionist Council. YOU have a chance to vote for ARZA delegates who will introduce the following questions:

- *Will Israeli society and institutions respect and fairly treat all denominations, regardless of level of observance?*
- *Will gender equality be the norm – where men and women can pray and live as equals?*
- *Will we see lasting peace with security and stability for the land and people of Israel?*

ARZA is asking every American Jew who holds these values dear to stand with us. The delegation from the United States will be determined by an election conducted by the American Zionist Movement (AZM). It will take place from January 13, 2015 until April 30, 2015. **Voting is easy and can be completed online or by paper ballot.** All Jews over the age of 18 (as of June 30, 2015) can vote. One need not be a member of any other organization or Jewish institution in order to vote. Here is what we hope you will do in the coming weeks:

- Spread the word: Please encourage others to vote - family, friends and fellow congregants
- **Vote:** Vote for ARZA-Representing Reform Judaism at www.reformjews4israel.org between January 13th and April 30th. Voting is easy and quick. Because the election itself is self-financing, the cost for voting is \$10.00 for those over age 30 and \$5.00 for those 30 and under.

The future of *K'lal Yisrael* is in our hands. Let us join with Reform and progressive Jews across the country and make sure that our voices are heard.

We have reached above the \$7000 needed for the torah, insurance, a new cover, and other expenses. Torah Study

After more than 10 years, we finally completed our course of study on the five books of the Torah. We have moved on to study the writings of the Prophets. This is the second division of the sacred writings. In the Hebrew canon the Prophets are divided into (1) the Former Prophets (Joshua, Judges, Samuel, and Kings) and (2) the Latter Prophets (Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and the Twelve, or Minor, Prophets: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi). We will be working from *The Jewish Study Bible*, ed. by Brettler and Michael Fishbane. The book is easily available from Amazon (and use **AmazonSmile**—see below!).

This should be a fascinating continuation of our study, and we hope that many of you will join the discussion. We meet approximately twice a month, and the full schedule is available on the Temple calendar at our website. If you have any questions about this program, please feel free to contact Rabbi Jacobs, Shari Augins, or Hattie Kaufman. It is the interesting mix of students that really enriches the study,
