From Rabbi Jacobs

Hag Sameach / Happy Passover, and . . .

Dear Friends:



Soon after you read this message, our holiday of *Pesach* / Passover will have begun, the evening of 3 April to be exact. Once again, we will have the sacred opportunity to celebrate our Festival of Freedom unlike all others within our Jewish calendar and through our Jewish year.

The very heart of the experience of our celebration is our obligation—yes obligation!—to see ourselves as if we, too, came forth out of Egypt. For some, this is to be understood as a literal and physical journey from a place of oppression and persecution to a place of freedom. For others of us, it is to be understood as a complex emotional and psychological journey from a place of debasement and degradation to a place of liberation. Either way, *Pesach* / Passover only becomes Jewishly meaningful when we choose to identify ourselves in either of these contexts.

Then, too, there is the whole question of slavery, Jewishly and humanly understood as one having ownership over another human being—a violation of everything holy in our Jewish religious tradition. Whatever else we may say about our historical journey to this moment in our history, it is a consistent recognition that no one individual or group has the right to own any other individual or group. And, yes, we have suffered mightily for our rejection of this notion of enslavement. In the fall there is *Chanukah*; in the spring there

is *Pesach* / Passover. rather different holy days with a common message of freedom: that as religious Jews, we must be free to worship the G-d of Israel as G-d intends, and that no one has the right to deprive us of that freedom to do so.

G-d never intended, however, that our journey was to be an easy one; only that it was to be one with the potential for *brachot* / blessings. As American Jews, this year in particular, let us give thanks for G-d that here, in this place, we are free to celebrate our Festival of Freedom. And, of course, *L'shana haba b'Yerushalayim* / Next year, G-d willing, in Jerusalem!

 - **Individual (Single):** \$650
 - **Senior Individual (Single), a new category:** \$520 (20% discount from Single)
 - **Associate Status** (for those with full membership in another synagogue; non-voting): 50% of applicable category
- Note: "Family" is defined as a household with more than one person. "Senior" is age 65 and over.*

ARZA: Cast a Vote for Reform Values in Israel

The Association of Reform Zionists of America is Reform Judaism's support group for Israel. Arza delegates are running for positions on the World Zionist Council. YOU have a chance to vote for ARZA delegates who will introduce the following questions:

- *Will Israeli society and institutions respect and fairly treat all denominations, regardless of level of observance?*
- *Will gender equality be the norm – where men and women can pray and live as equals?*
- *Will we see lasting peace with security and stability for the land and people of Israel?*

ARZA is asking every American Jew who holds these values dear to stand with us. The delegation from the United States will be determined by an election conducted by the American Zionist Movement (AZM). It will take place from January 13, 2015 until April 30, 2015. **Voting is easy and can be completed online or by paper ballot.** All Jews over the age of 18 (as of June 30, 2015) can vote. One need not be a member of any other organization or Jewish institution in order to vote. Here is what we hope you will do in the coming weeks:

- Spread the word: Please encourage others to vote - family, friends and fellow congregants
- **Vote:** Vote for ARZA-Representing Reform Judaism at **www.reformjews4israel.org** between January 13th and April 30th. Voting is easy and quick. Because the election itself is self-financing, the cost for voting is \$10.00 for those over age 30 and \$5.00 for those 30 and under.

The future of *K'lal Yisrael* is in our hands. Let us join with Reform and progressive Jews across the country and make sure that our voices are heard.

Torah Study

After more than 10 years, we finally completed our course of study on the five books of the Torah. We have moved on to study the writings of the Prophets. This is the second division of the sacred writings. In the Hebrew canon the Prophets are divided into (1) the Former Prophets (Joshua, Judges, Samuel, and Kings) and (2) the Latter Prophets (Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and the Twelve, or Minor, Prophets: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi). We will be working from *The Jewish Study Bible*, ed. by Brettler and Michael Fishbane. The book is easily available from Amazon (and use [AmazonSmile](#)—see below!).

This should be a fascinating continuation of our study, and we hope that many of you will join the discussion. We meet approximately twice a month, and the full schedule is available on the Temple calendar at our website. If you have any questions about this program, please feel free to contact Rabbi Jacobs, Shari Augins, or Hattie Kaufman. It is the interesting mix of students that really enriches the study,
