## From Rabbi Jacobs

### Something Special and Sacred

Dear Friends,

I am writing this message in the afterglow of a very special event which took place Sunday morning, April 26th, at the beginning of the last session of our growing Religious School. At this time we had the sacred opportunity to welcome into our Tuscaloosa Jewish Community Pearl Elise Silverstone, daughter of Murray Silverstone and Laura Reed, and sister of big brother Sydney. (see photo on p.8—Murray's parents came all the way from Baltimore, MD, to join the simcha.) We welcomed her in the presence of our Religious School young people, which made it even more special.

For a religious community to be meaningful to its members and sustain itself generation after generation, as I was taught early on, it must mark the moments of our life's journeys in meaningful ways: birth, growth, maturation, and death. And this we have been doing as people since our very beginnings more than 4,000 years ago. Some of our celebrations are biblically based (our weddings and funerals), some are rabbinically based (our *britot*/brises and *barai'* mitzvah), and some are modern (Consecration, Confirmation, and Naming Ceremonies for girls). Regardless of point of origin, they all share one thing in common: All of our life-cycle ceremonies are celebrations of life itself, our supreme value.

In fact, there is a Talmudic principle which states "*Pikuach nefesh docheh at Ha-Shabbat*"--which we may translate as "Even the most stringent law of the Sabbath may be overridden where life is at stake." And it is of course no accident that when we raise our Kiddush cups or other libations to toast a special moment in our lives, we shout out "L'chaim/To Life!"

Jewishly understood, life is to be lived fully and completely and enjoyed not only in the context and presence of family but in community as well. The next such community event will be the b'nai mitzvah of the Borak brothers, Jackson and Joshua. Please see invitation at the left.

And thus, we say to Laura and Murray, to Sydney, to their families, soon to the Borak family—and to our entire community as well:

## Co-Presidents' Message

We, as a congregation, continue to honor our "new" Torah. In April, we dressed it in a beautiful new mantle. Plans are now underway for a rededication ceremony in the fall.

On Sunday, September 20, 2015, between Rosh HaShannah and Yom Kippur, we will introduce this Torah, a survivor of the Holocaust, to our larger community. This will be a wonderful opportunity to reach out to all of Tuscaloosa with the story of tragedy and renewal.

Rabbi Jacobs is preparing a booklet that will be available to our members and visitors, chronicling the history of the Jews of Czechoslovakia and of these rescued Torahs. The booklet will also include a list of donors who have given to our Torah fund 10 chai (\$180) or more. It is only through the generosity of members of our congregation that we have been able to acquire the Torah and celebrate its entry to our community.

**It is not too late to add your name to this list with your contribution.** In addition to the initial costs to acquire the Torah, costs for insurance, appraisals, mantles, repairs to the ark to hold the Torahs securely, and for the rededication ceremony need to be covered by the fund.

We expect to have the booklet available by the time of the rededication, and in order to allow time for formatting and printing, **the donors list must be completed no later than July 15.** Please send your donations to our Treasurer, Marcy Weinberger, at the Temple, 809 4<sup>th</sup> Ave, Tuscaloosa, AL 35401 and indicate that it is for the Torah fund.

As we honor the Torah, it honors us by its presence among us.

## Membership Categories & Dues

The following membership categories and minimum dues levels were approved by congregational vote at the Annual Meeting in June, 2013:

- **Family:** \$1300
  - **Senior Family:** \$1040 (20% discount from Family)
  - **Individual (Single):** \$650
  - **Senior Individual (Single), a new category:** \$520 (20% discount from Single)
  - **Associate Status** (for those with full membership in another synagogue non-voting): 50% of applicable category
- Note: "Family" is defined as a household with more than one person. "Senior" is age 65 and over.*

These may be purchased for simchas—for instance, anniversaries, landmark birthdays, graduations, births, b'nai mitzvot, or other occasions. ## Torah Study

After more than 10 years, we finally completed our course of study on the five books of the Torah. We have moved on to study the writings of the Prophets. This is the second division of the sacred writings. In the Hebrew canon the Prophets are divided into (1) the Former Prophets (Joshua, Judges, Samuel, and Kings) and (2) the Latter Prophets (Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, and the Twelve, or Minor, Prophets: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, and Malachi). We will be working from *The Jewish Study Bible*, ed. by Brettler and Michael Fishbane. The book is easily available from Amazon (and use **AmazonSmile**—see below!).

This should be a fascinating continuation of our study, and we hope that many of you will join the discussion. We meet approximately twice a month, and the full schedule is available on the Temple calendar at our website.
