From Rabbi Jacobs

Jews do not do "Charity"!

Dear Friends,
One of the most misunderstood and mistranslated of Hebrew words is *tzedakah*. Most of us tend to translate it as charity—which truly is not a Jewish idea. Even though the word "charity" comes from the Latin *caritas*, caring, and we DO care for others, the term *tsedakah* is different.

In the Torah, we have the famous sentence "*Tzedek, tzedek tirdof*" which does not refer to charity at all, but rather to the important of justice within a biblical and legal context. The great sage Maimonides (1135-1204) referred to the "8 Steps of the Ladder of *Tzedakah*" the highest of which was to help others anonymously, without any acknowledgement.

In both cases—and others—we best understand this centrally-important Judaic concept as righteous obligation. That is to say, we who are blessed are righteously, religiously, Jewishly obligated to help those who have not been so blessed. And not always financially, but that certainly is among the first obligations.

Thus, when you write a check to help others, please understand that you are not giving charity (except as far as the IRS is concerned); you are doing *tsedakah*. You are acting according to the highest of our religious principles. When you participate in a community activity designed to help others, including members of our congregation, you are not giving charity but doing *tsedakah*. And I certainly include your contributions to our Rabbi's Discretionary Fund which enables me on all our behalves to support the good works that others do in the larger community, locally, regionally, and nationally.

As the new Jewish Year gradually approaches, let us continue to enjoy these summer days. And let us remember as well that doing the right thing—*tsedakah*—is what it's all about.

Co-Presidents' Message

On Sunday, September 20, 2015, between Rosh HaShannah and Yom Kippur, we will introduce the 'new' Torah, a survivor of the Holocaust, to our larger community. This will be a wonderful opportunity to reach out to all of Tuscaloosa with the story of tragedy and renewal.

Rabbi Jacobs and committee are preparing a booklet that will be available to our members and visitors, chronicling the history of the Jews of Czechoslovakia and of these rescued Torahs. The booklet will also include a list of donors who have given to our Torah fund 10 chai (\$180) or more. It is only through the generosity of members of our congregation that we have been able to acquire the Torah and celebrate its entry to our community.

It is not too late to add your name to this list with your contribution. In addition to the initial costs to acquire the Torah, costs for insurance, appraisals, mantles, repairs to the ark to hold the Torahs securely, and for the rededication ceremony need to be covered by the fund.

We expect to have the booklet available by the time of the rededication, and in order to allow time for formatting and printing, **the donors list must be completed no later than July 15.** Please send your donations to our Treasurer, Marcy Weinberger, at the Temple, 809 4th Ave, Tuscaloosa, AL 35401 and indicate that it is for the Torah fund.
