Making Sense of Our World

Dear Friends:

The academic definition of "religion" I use in my Religious Studies work at the University is "religion is our best attempt to make sense of our world *so that we may function in it.*" I can already hear the scientists in our community and congregation suggesting that scientific rationalism presents the same goal. Yet, as my mentors—scientific and other—taught me: we are asking two differently important questions: scientifically the question of "how"; religiously the question of "why".

Personally, I would offer the idea that, throughout our Jewish history, that is precisely what our forebears attempted and continue to do—make sense of our chaotic world so that we as a people may function in it as a decided minority in an all-too-often immensely hostile world. And we have survived as a people because we have looked at our world without

rose-colored glasses, as realistically as humanly as possible, come up with honest and pragmatic solutions to life's difficulties and its successes as well.

Judaism is not a pie-in-the-sky rose-tinted view of the world but a religious world-view that asks of us that we make full use of our G-d-given intellectual gifts to build a world better than the one into which we were privileged to enter.

That challenge is called in our Jewish Religious Tradition *l'takein olam b'mal-*

chut Shaddai—repairing a broken world beneath the sovereignty of G-d's Holy Presence.

So as we approach our springtime festivals of both Purim and Pesach, let us think rationally and seriously—and Jewishly—what is required of us to live in our world as *religious* Jews. And, as Captain Jean-Luc Picard of the Starship Enterprise would have it, "Make it so!"

- **Associate Status** (for those with full membership in another synagogue non-voting): 50% of applicable category

Note: "Family" is defined as a household with more than one person. "Senior" is age 65 and over.
