Dear Friends:

I have long been intrigued with the implications of the close proximity of the Book of Esther/Holiday of Purim and the Book of Exodus/Holiday of Pesach/Passover. The former is a celebration over a near-genocidal tragedy against our Jewish People and the latter is our successful escape from the enslavement of Egyptian into the desert towards the liberating freedom of the Holy Land of Israel. Wow!

It's not a stretch of my rabbinical imagination--or yours either--to suggest they are really interconnected: It has been our fate throughout history to be naysayers--to reject both false gods and false and/or compromised nation-state systems of governance and morality. Our evolving but nonetheless continuous striving towards ever-higher moral standards continues to position us against those who would continue to do harm to us and the larger human communities as well.

While we continue to celebrate Purim in jest and laughter and Pesach as family time with story-telling and laughter as well, in truth, what we are really celebrating in both instances is life itself (L'chaim!) both as individuals and as family and community.

So....now that Purim has passed, let us get together for our Temple Seder on the 22nd and celebrate ourselves, our families, our Jewish People, our Judaism, and life itself!
