Thoughts on Judaism and Politics



Dear Friends:

The Internal Revenue Services (IRS) is clear: if clergy and their institutions promote specific candidates or particular political parties, they violate *both the separation of church and state and their own tax-exempt status*. We can, however, urge constituencies to participate in the electoral process as good stewards and good citizens, and can address specific issues from the perspectives of their/our own religious traditions. Therefore, there will be no recommendations from this Rabbi about whom to vote for or against. I hope now after more than sixteen years you are able to discern my positions on various issues of Jewish, American, and Israeli importance, and I will make no comments on the various political parties that make up the American political landscape.

However, what am I to make of the following facts: Two of the (unnamed) presidential candidates have Jewish sons-in-law! One of the (unnamed) presidential candidates is Jewish and actually lived and worked for a time on a kibbutz in Israel. These factoids seem to matter little to the overall contests—except when the ongoing Middle East crises and the Arab-Israeli-Palestinian conflicts heat up and the positions of the candidates themselves become part of the conversation.

What it says to me, therefore, is what others have concluded as well: That whatever else we could say about our status as a minority, and de-

spite the continuing existence of antisemitism in these United States, we Jews have become and are a successfully-integrated population overall. Our successes are not ours alone but contribute to the overall successes of our country as well, and pride in individual successes is evident.

My hope and prayer is that all the positives we enjoy should only contin-

ue, and, as we affirm our responsibility to participate in this grand experiment we call America—as we have done since our arrival in 1654—let us continue to do so as proud Jews and as committed citizens.
